### Board Bits What your Board did at their last meeting, March 9th



Everyone on the board was in attendance with the exception of L.D. We started at 6:38 pm and went home around 8:30 pm. No other members of the congregation were present.

Jim Murphy acted as our Process Observer and timekeeper for the meeting.

Minutes were approved for the last meeting and reports were accepted.

Agreed to hire another nursery worker to handle the additional young children.

The board agreed to send Elbert & Marion Hill to the UUA General Assembly as our official delegates in Minneapolis in June.

Need to find someone to be the SWUUC representatives for the meeting to be held on April 24, 2010.

Special reports on the Stewarship Drive, NTAUUS Luncheon, and DBLE.

L.D. was asked to check the By-Laws and find any amendments which need to be made to them for this spring.

Purchase of an RRUU sign was authorized for the corner of Spur 503 and Harrison Road since we now have permission from the owner of the corner property to put one up.

Brief update on the state of the union - attendance - accomplishments - still to be done.

Policies & procedures report - new manual is progressing. An attempt will be made to have the initial manual ready for concept approval at the Congregational Meeting on May 16. P&P would have to be ready to be mailed/emailed on April 28.

Logo - Tweeking of the design is still underway and should be completed shortly.

Standing on the Side of Love - immigration cards were purchased for Social Justice by Marla - and put into the bulletin by Dianna N-H. Hope to collect all which are given out to be mailed back to program.

It is going to be requested that all board and committee chairs submit their pledge cards prior to April 10. If you would like to see the full board minutes – they will be

**posted on the "Board Board" in the back of the Sanctuary as soon** as they are available. The next board meeting is April 13th, starting at 6:30 p.m. Board meetings are open to all; if you wish to be on the agenda please contact a board member. Deadline for the agenda, and reports to the board, is April 9th. Those wishing a **few minutes during the "open mic" will want to be ready to speak** near the end of the meeting.

## Treasurer's Report



Are you thinking about it? Have you asked yourself and reflected on the question to determine if you are the one? Would you like to stretch yourself to learn and grow? Could YOU be next in line? Do you have what it takes to be the new treasurer at RRUU? While I have asked the nominating committee to search for a new treasurer to free me to engage in other ministries at RRUU, I will most assuredly be there to work beside my replacement and avoid the tremendous learning curve we were faced with in fiscal year 2009-2010. Please consider if this is a way you might serve your church. Without a doubt my spirituality has deepened as a result of being intimately aware of the generosity and faithfulness of the RRUU family. Each week treasurer responsibilities call me to think of and send positive energy out for our congregation. Ask the Universe if you are my successor... and wait guietly to hear the response.

During March I took a hard look at our income, expenditures and budget. Because the revised budget **was not entered into the computer it's categories do** not always coincide with those on our Quicken Pro software. This meant it was necessary to create a budget vs. actual expense report manually. The bottom line is we are living within our means though pledging was at an all time low this fiscal year. Our year-to-date figures for FY 2010 the end of February (July 1, 2009 to February 28, 2010) show an income of \$32,184.57 and expenses of \$28,476.91 for a net income of \$3,707.66. Please note \$3,000 of the net income are designated funds, not available for general budget use.

Our February income was \$5,347.03 and our expenses were \$5,124.90 for a net income of \$222.13. The income includes the \$2038.80 special collections for **Haitian Relief. Our Second Sunday "Share the Plate"** offerings for February went to our local NAACP chapter in honor of Black History Month.

## Message from Marla Marla Loturco, President, RRUU



Time Flies!! Sometimes there is just no substitute for a cliché. One month ago Carla Murphy, Joyce Peak and I were at the Southwest Unitarian Universalist **Women's Conference in Dallas. It was an interesting,** informative, uplifting and engrossing event. The workshops, worship services and other events were a much needed break from my normal routine. I was sorry to miss the RRUU worship service that week as I was looking forward to learning more about Harriett Tubman but the closing ceremony with a spiral dance of 100 plus women was a moving, spiritual experience I was glad I had attended. I highly recommend the **Women's Conference to all of the women in RRUU for** next year. It will again be held in Dallas.

Time really flies. These past 10 months at RRUU have been both a challenge and extremely rewarding. When I look at what has been accomplished in such a short time I am amazed. With 49 members total there are 26 members in a leadership position of some type. We currently average 36 adults in attendance each Sunday morning. The children's average attendance is 7. We are having a paid pulpit supply two to three times a month. We have adopted new by-laws, a behavioral covenant, Green Guidelines and a new logo. Our new Policies & Procedures manual is well underway. We have written two grants – one for sound equipment and one for training on creating a five-year plan. At the recent NTAUUS awards luncheon RRUU received funding from NTAUUS for each grant. We received \$3,300 for consulting and training on developing a five year plan and \$2,500 for the purposes of Audio/Video equipment. Another exciting occurrence at the awards luncheon, our own Amy Hoffman-Shehan was recognized by NTAUUS and awarded the Marty Robinson Award for Volunteerism for her work in the church, the community and on the Earth Day Texoma

outreach project. We all celebrate you Amy! All of us can be proud of our efforts.

I hope by now everyone has sent your R.S.V.P. for our annual Fellowship Dinner, this year at the Paper Plate Restaurant in Denison. The dinner is our time to celebrate our faith in one of the finest UU traditions – **breaking bread together! We haven't had a large all**church dinner since last Thanksgiving. There is something worthwhile to gather in fellowship beyond Sunday morning – a time to meet friends and perhaps make friends. The evening is a gift from ourselves to ourselves – the church is picking up the tab to assure that everyone can be included. During the evening **we'll sing, laugh, eat, and celebrate this, our 13th year** of liberal religion in the Red River Valley. I look forward to seeing you there.

Also this month, April 24th is the Earth Day Festival. Please consider volunteering to help either at the festival or anytime before. Since it is sponsored by our Green Team it would be good if we could all support the outreach effort. Also when you come to the festival you will no doubt see scores of recycled water bottles with our church name and logo – a gift from two members of the congregation who donated the money to make RRUU a water bottle sponsor. We are an active, not-so-gentle, PR effort to let people know there is one church in the area that maintains a ministry to the Earth.

Then in May is our annual congregational meeting on Sunday, May 16th. Save the date! With all that is going on in the world – from national politics, to earthquakes **and wars, isn't it wonderful that we have a community** of kindred spirits and a place where we can come to pause and ponder what life and love and hope means to each of us?

I'm proud of what we've done and are doing and will do. I hope you are as well. See you in church, friends

## **"Fill the Plate"** Feeds Hungry People In Texoma

RRUU is engaged in the life of our communities... one way is through our ongoing "Fill the Plate" collection. Light green plastic bins and a lock box are in the back of the sanctuary for "Fill the Plate." Friends and Members of RRUU are welcome to bring paper/hygiene/cleaning products, non-perishable foods and/or add to the cash collection at any time. (remember area pantries can get food for 10 cents a pound, so cash gifts help the most).

On 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays, this month the 25<sup>th</sup>, we will dedicate the gifts in worship, tally the cash box, and then deliver the items and check to an area food pantry.

April is paper month at RRUU. Many food pantry guests are people whose food stamps did not last to **month's end. Essentials like toilet tissue, feminine hy**giene products, paper towels and disposable diapers are costly and <u>even essential paper products CANNOT</u> <u>BE PURCHASED WITH FOOD STAMPS</u>. We also have the chance to pass on our commitment to being earth **friendly by buying and donating "green" recycled pa**per products.
