Board Bits ~ from the Jan 17th Board Meeting

The board meeting was held on January 17, 2012. All members were present.

In addition to normal board business the following topics were covered.

- Finished planning the February 5, Special Congregational Meeting.
- Finalized the calling plan, documents and meeting agenda.
- Planned the Thanks & Appreciation Dinner for February 18, 2012

- Reports were given on the Commitment Campaign, Celebration Dinner
- In February all board members will be ready to review the first three sections of the Policies & Procedures Manual
- It was decided that Long Term Planning will be bequeathed to the next board – after their board retreat.

 A new date needs to be found for the Board Retreat since July 14th is the NTAUUS Board Training

The next board meeting is February 21, 2012, starting at 6:40 p.m. Board meetings are open to all, if you wish to be on the agenda please contact a board member. Deadline for the agenda and reports to the board is February 14. Those wishing a few minutes during the "open mic" will want to be ready to speak around 7:00 pm.

Financial Update ~the treasurer's report

"While reports continue to be upbeat regarding church renovations, incoming funds for church operations are not so positive."

Reports from the treasurer continue to be upbeat when it comes to the church renovation. Another \$7,000 was donated to the renovation fund in January; this was much-appreciated as over \$16,000 was spent for improvements this month. The front porch looks beautiful, and the railing is underway. Doug Strong was again busy selling seating and added \$250 to the general savings fund. Thanks to his efforts,

\$3,250 has been earned from the sale of pews and chairs. The income will be used to purchase new tables and chairs.

Incoming funds for church operation were not so positive. Although approximately \$9,700 was added to the RRUU treasury in January, over \$7,300 was earmarked for special funds – the renovation, Grayson County Shelter (our Second Sunday Share-the-Plate recipient) the purchase of chairs and tables, etc.

This left under \$2,400 to operate the church, and operating costs topped \$2,900.

In order to assist our budget, we recently changed insurance agents. RRUU is now being insured through Insurance One Agency of Dallas. This company saved our church money and better suited our needs. We received a credit of \$620 from Church Mutual, our former agency.
