Some highlights from the voting for me were:

- The 2019-2020 Budget was approved: This document is now available on our web site.
- The 2019-2024 Strategic Plan was approved: This document is also on our web site.
- We voted a name for our Monarch Butterfly Garden.
- We unanimously elected the new slate of church leadership.
- We accepted the first year recommendations in the Strategic Plan as our goals for this next year.

Let me say a bit about our new set of goals. They are:

- Complete Facilities list for 2019
- Add live stream to services and staff
- Make live stream available to RE room, Emerson room, and our <u>Facebook</u> page
- Apply for NTUUC Grant (subject TBD)
- Fill position for Outreach Coordinator
- Fill position for RE Team Leader
- Create a Building Expansion Fund and Emergency Facilities Fund
- Add 1 Outreach program

This is an ambitious list but not unachievable. Two very important items on this list are to find an Outreach Coordinator and a RE Team Leader. If any of you are interested in finding out more about these positions, please contact me.

The item on live streaming will require some financial expense for the equipment (about \$3000-\$5000 estimated in the 5 Year Strategic Plan). In addition, the AV desk area will need to be re-worked

and enlarged to support two computers. Most importantly, we will need volunteers to run this operation.

# Moving Into Prison Ministry: An Introduction to the Prison Industrial Complex

Sat. June 8 at Horizon UU Church - Free! Open to All.

Religious freedom for people living in systems of mass incarceration is protected by the 1st Amendment of the US Constitution. Yet exploring and practicing a wide breadth of spiritual and religious views can be challenging. Prisons are dominated by largely fundamentalist teachings and resources.

This conference will help people interested in prison ministry who offer alternative perspectives and can support the unmet religious and spiritual needs of those who are incarcerated. Prison ministry is an expansive term that can include such activities as becoming a pen worship services in prison, advocating, and more.

Learning about the realities of the prison industrial complex will help you engage in both prison ministry and justice work. This event is hosted by the Worthy Now Prison Ministry Network, a program of the <u>Church of the Larger Fellowship</u>, <u>UU</u>. Details about the workshop are <u>here</u>.
