

We WILL come to the live morning assembly on our Independence Day.

The church reopens its doors on July 4th.

Yes, in our May congregational meeting the attendees, along with the on-line survey participants, agreed that we are ready for the church to open. Since we need a month to get the church ready, we picked July 4^{th} as our reopening date.

To get ready for the big day, the Board has created two documents. The first is a detailed list of what we need to do before we open our doors. The building has been closed since last March, so it has over a year of accumulated dust and clutter. Also, a few items need repairs. We are planning a **volunteer cleaning day on June 26th.** Please join us if you can.

The second document is a safety protocol document that details any procedures that need to be followed not only for cleaning but also for allowing people to safely be in the building. Since the CDC rules around these subjects are quickly evolving and changing, the Board will finalize this document in their June 20th meeting and post it in the July Newsletter, our website, and mobile app.

The Worship, Adult Forum, and AV Teams are working on the ability to have our virtual friends take part with us on Zoom Live sessions for the Adult Forum, Morning Assembly and Conversations & Coffee as well those that may feel uncomfortable coming into the building. We will continue to upload the recording of each morning assembly to Youtube and Facebook afterward for those who couldn't make the in house or Zoom session on Sunday.

Financial Report for April

In the month of April, we had total receipts of \$2,598.75 after the Ronda DeCaire Memorial Fund of \$2,545.00 was transferred out of Other Income into its own fund account and \$233.75 investment income from our UUCEF account was transferred and shows as increases in those funds. Expenses for the month totaled \$4,246.76. The result was an excess of expenditures over receipts of \$1,648.01.

As of April 30, 2021, we had \$6,635.22 available in checking, \$16,538.32 in general savings, \$13,826.94 in the Endowment Fund at our UUCEF (Unitarian Universalist Common Endowment Fund), and \$62,751.89 in the Savings Fund at UUCEF for a total of \$95,662.15 in all savings accounts. We have a total of \$2,841.09 remaining on the renovation loan. Ronda DeCaire Memorial Fund has a total of \$2,545.00.

This is somewhat confusing because we actually had income of \$2598.75 and actual expenditures of \$1701.76, leaving and excess of income over expenditures of \$896.99.

The other expenditures were really transfers of the Ronda DeCaire Memorial Fund of \$2545.00 to Other Income and the \$233.75 investment income from UUCEF was transferred to the UUCEF savings accounts, so they really weren't expenditures, but transfers within our own account.
