# Welcome To Our Hybrid Church Community

When we closed the building on March 14, 2020, no one knew much about what it takes to become a 'virtual' church. Most of us didn't know how to join a Zoom meeting.

We had a visiting minister scheduled for the next day. He was already in town. The worship team and the board decided we could stream the morning assembly from the Emerson Room at church and went to town setting up lights, camera, microphone. Then came the first problem: our internet connection at church was way too s-l-o-w. Early Sunday morning we shifted to Doug's living room, with Dan at the dining room table (Dan could speak 'Zoom') and Jim & Don knew a bit about cameras.

Our first virtual morning worked. We learn plenty about what we did *not* know. The next week we were back at church - having doubled the church internet speed and for the next 67 Sundays a small group of volunteers became

The effort needed to open the church for July 4th is not just opening the doors. We closed the building in March 2020, so we have 15 months of accumulated dust, spider webs, and undone cleaning that needs to be taken care of. We also had a plumbing leak in the upstairs toilet that caused damage to the kitchen ceiling and other minor plumbing issues plus a dish washer that quit working. We also needed to expand our online capabilities in the Chapel, Gil Alexander room, and RE classroom. Much of this is now done and complete thanks to many people: the Board, Membership Team, Worship Team, AV Team, Facilities Building and Grounds Teams, Monarch Butterfly Garden Team, RE Team, and the wonderful group of people that showed up on June 26th for our cleaning day.

NTUUC is giving out Grants again and they will be announcing recipients in July. The Grant we are presenting is to fund Red

River UU so we can buy the additional equipment needed to complete our vision to support video streaming the Gil Alexander room and RE classroom and nursery. Thanks to equipment donations from members, we will be partially there for July 4th. If we get the Grant we will be able to complete this project. Please bear with us on July 4th. It's our first live/Zoom Sunday so we are working out the kinks. We also have put some of our capabilities together with less than optimal equipment. Hopefully, it will all run smoothly.

Be sure to read the Safety Protocol document in this newsletter so you will be familiar with what to expect when you come to church on July 4th. The Board will continue to review the latest CDC guidelines and any feedback we get from our members. We will adjust these guidelines as needed going forward as CDC information changes. Our current protocols recommend that masks are optional for those who have had both vaccines. For those that have not been completely vaccinated we ask that you wear your mask. Social distancing will not be required in the Chapel. The Gil Alexander room will be setup to show the live streaming service (Zoom) for those that want to observe from a more social distance environment.

Starting July 1st, we have a new budget year and a new Board. I want to thank Lisa Cates and Sabra Jones for their service on the Board during their 2-year term, they will be missed. I also want to welcome Dick Powell back to the Board as Treasurer, Marilyn Alexander as Vice President, Amy Hoffman-Shehan as the at-large representative, and David Dyer as Secretary.

As part of our AV capabilities expansion, we have added a 2nd camera in the Chapel to give us more recording options for recording our Morning Assembly and other events. One of the duties for this second camera is to show the audience at times during the Assembly. If you don't want to be seen on camera you will need to sit on the side rows near the AV desk. If you want much more on-camera action, the AV Team takes donations!

For anyone that can't come in on Sunday or Zoom in to watch us live, we are also recording the service and will be posting it to YouTube and Facebook. Our plan is to have it uploaded by 5PM on the following Monday.

If you like live music, we are planning on having Jan's music Circle at Church on July 3rd starting at 6pm. Arrive between 5:30 and 6. Some of the musicians will be joining us on Zoom so this will be a good test of our live/Zoom capabilities.

We have three very busy people on the AV Team; myself, Marla Loturco, and Don Rogers. We need help and need to add more team members so if you are interested talk to one of us.

The building is open again, we have comfy chairs to sit on, a chapel where we can again celebrate our liberal faith, and the crew that made it possible can take it easy.

That's not going to happen. These 15 months have shown us that the ways in which we may worship are vastly more expansive than we imagined.

Grand Central Station soup kitchen and food pantry in Sherman is in desperate need of new regular volunteers. We lost volunteers during COVID, and some have not returned. (We maintained services during the height of the pandemic through take-out meals but have returned to indoor dining. However, volunteers have limited direct interaction with patrons. We have a new facility and expand capacity. Volunteer rosters are the limiting factor now.

Most volunteers help prepare lunches from about 8 to 1 on M-F. Many people work one day a month or one day a week. Those who work directly with food need a food handlers license. Obtaining one is about a 2-hour online process (maybe less). If you are interested in volunteering, staff or other volunteers will explain the procedure.

In the month of May, we had total receipts of \$5,112.16. Expenses for the month totaled \$1,822.22. The result was an excess of income over receipts of \$3,289.94.

As of May 31, 2021, we had \$7,198.00 available in checking, \$16,538.32 in general savings, \$14,229.10 in the Endowment Fund at UUCEF, and \$64,576.89 in the Savings Fund at UUCEF for a total of \$97,889.31 in all savings accounts.

We have a total of \$2,841.09 remaining on the renovation loan.
