We could use help setting up and bringing breakfast food. Please contact me if you can help. We will be meeting there to set it up at 7:15 AM.

Ribbon Cutting and Open House on March 6<sup>th</sup>, 3:00-5:00 PM at our church. This is our biggest opportunity to introduce Red River UU to the Denison Chamber of Commerce and the Texoma community. We anticipate 25-50 people and will serve appetizers and adult beverages.

Here is how you can help.

1. Go through our building and put away items to make it more inviting to guests?

2. Put the grounds in top condition and new plants in the porch pots. If the flowers in the sign flower bed didn't survive the freeze, they may need to be replanted, as well. Fortunately, Paula and Larry Jennings have been doing a great job on the grounds, but the north bed of our Monarch butterfly garden needs attention.

**3.** Select and donate one of the following: meat trays, cheese trays, fruit trays, other finger food appetizers, cookies, wine, beer, and sodas.

**4.** Bring a door prize. Some that have been suggested including a) Red River UU shopping bag with 2 mugs and brochures, b) housewares, c) wine basket.

5. Lead tours of the church and make people feel welcome and comfortable?

6. Hopefully, we will also have James Smith, the funeral director who owned our building for many years, here to give its history. Also, Jan is inviting a descendant of the family who built the original house available to talk about it. They will need to be introduced to guests.

Well friends, you now have many ways to show your love this month. Our open house will either be a glowing success that people will remember and share with others, or we'll fail, and the impression left on our guests will haunt us for a long time.

We have a bright yellow handout called "Love Beyond Belief" in the foyer literature rack. Let's keep "Love Beyond Belief" in our hearts and our actions during February, The Month of Love.

Here are highlights from the January board meeting.

- Jim advised he has been in contact with Cameron Young. Young reported that our profile is on the UUA portal so that ministers can now look for us. We cannot look for them. Young also said he would help with Chalice Lighters grant for minister compensation fund. Jim also talked to Daniel Polk who advised Denton was losing their minister. It was suggested that we could partner with them having a ¾ time minister here and a ¼ time minister there. The Minister Search Team will meet again in February.
- The home page on our website now includes minister search updates. One effective way to let everyone know about upcoming events is to send the details to <u>news@redriveruu.org</u> so the event will be in the church calendar. As always, any church closures due to weather, etc. are posted on the homepage and in the This Sunday information, following consultation with AV and Worship teams, as they are integral for our Sunday morning assemblies.
- The Vision Statement Task Force will soon finalize their recommendation so it can be voted on at the Spring Meeting.
- Amy is completing a FEMA survey so the Emergency Preparedness team will be ready to submit a grant application to FEMA as soon as the FEMA grant is made available.
- The board members completed the last area of the required annual UUA Certification Survey during the meeting, so it was submitted on time.
- The Welcoming Congregation group held a very successful "Framily Christmas Party" with 30-40 people

attending. Adrian also held a New Year's Eve board games party. They are planning a Fairy Tea Party for February 10.

- The board discussed adding the Welcoming Congregation to the Policy and Procedures Manual and decided that since that committee has evolved in purpose that it belongs under Social Justice. A statement will be added to the Policy and Procedures Manual noting that the church must update its Welcoming Certification through the UUA every two years.
- The "SumFun Summer Children's Experience" has been cancelled until we have more children to draw from.
- The congregation was asked to approve the Stebbins Amendment that appeared in the Wednesday UPDATE, but the board felt that since no congregational meeting was scheduled prior to the Feb. 1<sup>st</sup> deadline, we could not approve the Stebbins Amendment for the 2024 GA meeting. However, if it receives approval from at least 15 other congregations, then it will be put on the agenda for our Spring Congregational Meeting. At that time, we will have the opportunity to discuss the amendment and forward our response to our delegates for action prior to the GA Meeting.
- This year's Giving Tree focused more on the daily supplies that we go through and regretfully fell short. So, we will post a list of the critical supplies with toilet paper at the top we still need and will invite all to help.

Minister Search Team

We did not meet in January, but we were active in these areas.

Cameron Young (our UUA representative with the Southern Region) got back with us to let us know that the Chalice Lighter grants are currently open. There is not a lot of money available per grant request.

Cameron did say that because we had a minister, we may not quality but suggested we still apply. The committee will be looking into this and decide how best we can address this in our grant request.

We also talked with Daniel Polk who informed us that Denton is losing their minister who is taking a position with another UU church. Denton may be interested in sharing a minister. We will follow up with this but have the requirement that the minister live in the Texoma area and does their primary community work in our area. I sent another copy of our UUA Congregational Application Packet to Daniel in case he hears of any candidates.

For now, no actual activity has happened in talking with candidates. Hopefully, things will pick up as we start this new year.

Money Matters

In the month of November, we had total receipts of \$2,269.00. Total expenses for the month were \$2,432.19, leaving us with a small net loss for the month of (\$163.19).

We had a net profit for the fiscal year-to-date of \$3,234.03. The year-to-date net profit was primarily due to higher other income, partly offset by costs to improve building security and the timing of various other costs.

As of November 30, 2023, we had \$13,299.31 available in checking. There is a total of \$20,747.33 in the bank savings account, including \$4,667.08 restricted for the Minister Fund and \$5,951.89 held in trust for Kat Walston from the sale of her personal effects prior to moving into assisted living. There is a total of \$66,784.40 invested in the UUA Common Endowment Fund. The congregation voted to use up to \$51,000.00 of the Endowment Fund for minister compensation, if needed.
