## Giving Hope. Making a Difference. Defeating Breast Cancer.

Jenel Marie McGrath, guest speaker

This year an estimated 310,720 women and 2,800 men will be diagnosed with invasive breast cancer. Chances

are, you know at least one person who has been personally affected by breast cancer. But there is hope. When caught in its earliest, localized stages, the 5-year relative survival rate is 99%. Advances in <u>early detection</u> and <u>treatment</u> methods have significantly increased breast cancer survival rates in recent years, and there are currently over 4 million breast cancer survivors in the United States. We've invited Jenel Marie McGrath - president of the Board at *Women Rock*, a Sherman based non-profit dedicated to defeating breast cancer - to speak about their efforts in giving hope, making an impact in defeating breast cancer. Of her discourse she writes, *"I expect to be informative, low key and delighted to extend my knowledge to all. Questions welcome."*

## A Journey in and out of Religion Marion Hill, *speaking*

Many people come to a Unitarian church after having been brought up in another denomination but then finding that their original religion didn't "work for them" in adulthood. Today Red River UU member Marion Hill will discuss the sometimes-surprising journey of Frank Schaeffer, whose parents were missionaries to Switzerland and who, in young adulthood, became a leader of the religious right, but then rebelled against that life. In three bestselling books—one of which is titled "Why I Am an Atheist Who Believes in God"—he details the twists and turns in his thinking that brought him to a position of both belief AND non-belief.

Comparing the evangelical/fundamentalists he knows so well to the New Atheists (Richard Dawkins, Christopher Hitchens, and others), he finds both of their approaches equally unsatisfactory.

Money Matters by Carole Harner, treasurer

The new year started in July 2024 with a very generous donation of \$50,000 from Marilyn Alexander's daughter, Merrilee Kick. A total of \$28,809.44 has been spent on repairs and renovations. That leaves \$21,190.56 remaining in this fund as of August 31.

In the month of August, we had total operating receipts of \$2,682.00. Total operating expenses for the month were \$2,212.68, leaving us with a small net profit for the month of \$469.32. The net profit for the month was primarily due to the timing of worship and insurance expense partly offset by the timing of pledge payments.

We had an operating net profit for the fiscal year-to-date of \$1,136.08. The year-to-date net profit was primarily due to the timing of worship and advertising expense partly offset by the timing of donations.

As of August 31, 2024, we had \$16,897.84 available in checking for general operations. There was also \$9,932.13 available in the bank savings account for general operations plus \$4,871.08 restricted for the Minister Fund and \$5,951.89 held in trust for Kat Walston from the sale of her personal effects prior to moving into assisted living. There is a total of \$66,784.40 invested in the UUA Common Endowment Fund. The congregation voted to use up to \$51,000.00 of the UUA Savings Fund for minister compensation

### October Already!

I have barely come to terms with it being September, and here it is October! Sweater weather, colorful foliage, the excitement of the holiday season being nearly upon us? Nope, not in Texas. We are now somewhat less hot than we were in August. We dig through the Christmas decorations at the big box stores to get to what we need to keep our yards and flower beds going. But nightfall is coming earlier and dawn later. It's a time for each of us to pause, look back at the year so far, and consider what we want to finish by the year's end.

It's also a time for us as an institution to pause and look back at the year so far and to take time to reconnect as an active congregation. Our Fall Congregational Meeting is on October 20<sup>th</sup>, following the service, and the information packets will go out soon. Please attend. Your voice needs to be heard.

Someone pointed out that in our spoken affirmation, agreeing to seek the truth seems to mean there is only one truth and that it makes them uncomfortable, knowing their truth is probably not shared by the people around them. We've used our current spoken affirmation for many years, made some changes for awhile, then returned to the current one. There are many variations of the wording in UU churches

There is power in tradition. It should not be changed willynilly. But there can also be stagnation. Times and people change. Our current affirmation is an artifact of our Christian heritage, even though it speaks so well for so many. I think it is important that we think about what we say. Our closing affirmation speaks of truth, not "the" truth. Think about this and have your say (and vote!) at the Fall Congregational Meeting. I think the outcome of the vote is not as important as the thought that goes into it.

Many folk believe that late October is when the spirit world draws closest to us, when the veil between the worlds is at its thinnest. May whatever spirits of any sort you encounter be blessings. Jana Norris, *president*
