Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Report as of December 31, 2025, For the fiscal year-to-date period of July 1 through December 31, we had an operating net profit of \$6,104.95. This was due to the timing of pledge donations and to lower expenses in several categories, partially offset by unbudgeted expenses for yardwork. As of December 31, 2025, we had \$22,151.53 available to be used for general operations in our bank checking account, \$9,960.21 available in our bank savings account, and approximately \$25,356.49 available in our UUA savings fund. The amount available in the UUA savings fund varies based on market value. In addition, we have the following restricted amounts: \$4,871.08 in our bank savings account restricted for the Minister Fund; \$5,951.89 in our bank savings account held in trust for Kat Walston; \$16,824.66 in the endowment fund; and \$51,000.00 restricted in the UUA Savings Fund for minister compensation. In addition to the results from operations, we have spent \$2,747.05 year-to-date from restricted funds leaving \$18,443.88 restricted to cover continuing repairs and renovations to the building and to increase visibility in the community to grow membership.

Social Action Updates

“Free Families” Vigils Successful

On January 18, the National Coalition to End Family and Child Detention, comprised of over 40 organizations across the country, called for an end to family detention, no funding for ICE and immediate action to stop the widespread abuse and neglect that children and adults are experiencing in ICE custody after weekend protests by those children and families. Protesters were heard chanting “*libertad*” (or “freedom”). The group called for a “Freedom Vigil” for Wednesday, January 28 at the Dilley, Texas Detention Center, south of San Antonio. Numerous members of Texas UU Justice Ministry hopped in buses and drove to join in the struggle to protect these children. U.S. Representatives [Jasmine Crockett](#) (TX-30) and [Joaquin Castro](#) (TX-20) planned to conduct an oversight visit of the facility, followed by a press conference in San Antonio with Ramos’ attorney.

Detainees in Dilley include 5-year-old Liam Ramos, who was detained along with his father in Minnesota after the boy came from preschool last week.

Also being held at Dilley is a 7-year-old named Diana Crespo. She and her parents were detained in the parking lot of a hospital in Portland, Oregon, two weeks ago. Her parents were trying to get help for the second grader who had a long-lasting nosebleed — but they never made it inside the hospital. The Oregon Nurses Association condemned what happened, saying, “No parent should ever be forced to weigh their child’s A federal judge has issued a temporary restraining order that Little Liam cannot be deported. However, ICE continues their tactics which continue to keep our immigrant community living in fear. Please, write your Federal Senators and Representatives to stop all funding for this ICE “reign of terror”!

Bending Texas Toward Justice Together

While our procession was grounded in peace and love, seeking to uplift the voices of children and families, in the end, our cries were still met with aggressive state violence. This is deeply traumatic and not OK, whether you were on the front line, face to face with trooper's shields, or whether you were on a bus waiting and praying for other people's safety.

I will say again. State violence is NOT OK. We cannot normalize this. We cannot accept it. We will not accept it. Our UU faith holds love at the center, affirms that every person has worth and dignity, and that we are all connected. Therefore, our souls yearn and our minds and bodies work for everyone to be free.

I was so moved late yesterday afternoon when a pocket of the crowd started to sing “This Little Light of Mine,” on the edge of the protest line, in the face of ICE agents.

Please keep shining your light for Liam, for all the children and families, and for “Libertad” for all.

If you were NOT there, please call and email your legislators today and every day. Tell them to do their jobs for the people. Don't stop calling until they end this hell of violence, ICE, and family separation and incarceration. We [hope to see you at Action Hour](#).
