It's hard to believe it's February – I've already made and abandoned a half-dozen New Year's resolutions! One thing I haven't forgotten, though, is to follow through on last month's review of our five year plan. Here's an update. In May of 2013, the Board set out a five-year plan with nine points:

1. Increase community projects from four to eight.

There has been no change in the number of community projects.

2. Develop Religious Education program for youth, with paid part-time Director, paid childcare in nursery, and average attendance of 20.

We have certainly struggled in this area, as many small congregations do. We are so very thankful for the volunteers who have agreed to spend time with visiting children. We have not abandoned plans to find an RE director, but the pool of good candidates is very small.

3. Growth in membership to 60 members.

We are delighted and honored to have welcomed recent new members. Over the last year our membership grew from 34 to our current 39.

4. Operate at a profit.

Hooray for us! We are very, very good at managing our finances and we frequently receive more in pledges and donations than we spend.

5. Attendance, including visitors and friends, to average 50 per week.

Our total weekly attendance has taken a recent turn up-

ward, but we average fewer than 30 attending.

6. Worship services with three ordained or professional speakers per month.

We believe we offer consistently good Sunday services, and we generally have two guest speakers a month. The Worship Team and Board of Trustees always welcome feedback from members. We understand that not everything appeals to everybody. We certainly appreciate praise, but we also see thoughtful critique as helping us to improve our planning and programs.

7. Increase interest groups from five to eight.

We are so happy to see the return of our musical Jam group, hosted by Jan Fletcher! The number of interest groups, though, remains fewer than eight.

8. Improve building and grounds.

The building and grounds are, I believe, a source of pride for us. We were recently award a grant of \$5500 from our local UU association (North Texas Unitarian Universalist Congregations-NTUUC) to improve the ceiling in our chapel. The building and grounds are a beautiful contribution to our neighborhood and we continue to improve them.

9. No minister planned in five years.

With membership of 39 members, it would be very difficult to consider having even a part-time minister. When we achieve a membership of 60, having that discussion could be very productive.

I would be remiss if I did not note that this new year has already been tinged with sorrow as we mourned the loss on January 11 of our dear friend, Gil Alexander. He was devoted to Red River and we will keenly miss him and his great heart. Our love always to his family, especially to his wife and partner in life, Marilyn.

Get Out The Vote

Last year Red River received a small UUA grant to pay for signs and a tent as part of a 'Get Out The Vote' project.

have officially started, it is time for us to gear up and see how many people we can get registered to vote.

The GOTV crew has identified several places where we can set up our tent, tables, chairs, pens and registration forms. Before starting however, everyone working in Texas must become a registrar. It entails going to the Election office (115 W. Houston, Sherman) and watching a brief video that explains the process. (There is no test, just the video.) Residents of Oklahoma can self register by filling out a state form and mailing it in. We can give out those forms.

Currently five people from church are planning on becoming registrar. The church will have a booth at the Earth Day Festival and throughout the next eight months we can set up as many places as we want. Interested in helping? Speak with Doug, or Lanan, or Robert.

Board Bits ~ from the January 24th Board meeting

Security at church - UU congregations are vulnerable and have been the target because of our ongoing support for all people. We're ripe to such action and we need to find ways to help assure that we will be safe in our space. To that end, the board agreed to

- Lock the back door at the start of worship
- Install a monitor to our video surveillance on the AV desk
- Add a chime alarm to the front door which will be turned on at the start of worship
- Provide a key to the building to those who need one
- Explore having a volunteer sit inside the

This training will help in confronting a situation, if one ever arises. He has extensive training in deescalating a potential crisis and, if this fails, the next steps to be taken.

The training will be on Sunday, Feb 28 - 30 minutes after the conclusion of the worship service.

Those who want to get this training, please attend the session. The more people who know the recommended ways to handle an agitated person, the better for everyone.

Marla Loturco of Red River UU is on the board of NTUUC as the secretary. This organization is a vital support to our Fellowship and it is essential for us to be involved. We receive education, training, and funding from this organization. It also connects us with the twelve other congregations in North Texas.

Around the Cluster:

Arlington UU Church - Working on finally qualifying as a Welcoming Congregation. It seems to be going successfully this time with new people being added to the task force every week.

Community UU Church - Current focus is on the building. There are many issues arising as it is an older building and they want it to look nicer to visitors as well as their congregation.

Denton UU Fellowship - They have been dealing with the fire experience for the last several months.

First UU Church of Dallas -Minister, Rev. Dr. Daniel Kanter has been in the hospital.

Horizon UU Church - Hosting a Mankind Project Workshop on Monday January 25 at 6:30 pm

Pathways Church - Everything is going well, had an inquirers class with five people and anticipating a new member ceremony on January 31 along with a congregational meeting to talk about the church DNA – how UU principles are embodied in the congregation.

Red River UU Church - Looking forward to replacing the chapel ceiling in the chapel and proud of Daniel Althoff for receiving the Marty Robinson Volunteer Award this year.

UU Church of Oak Cliff - Getting ready to order and install solar lighting for the parking lot – part of an NTUUC grant.

Westside UU Church - Deep in the ministerial search and holding their mid-year congregational meeting where they hope to decide to not renew the Montessori Lease, even though they will have to then come up with ways to fill in the budget. Would just like to have the church back for themselves.

NTUUC President - Been working on the March 5th workshop – it is very different format for NTUUC and very significant in our training and education growth – goal is to go interfaith

NTUUC Exec Director - Working on Luncheon and it seems to be coming together.

NTUUC Webmaster - Keeping busy with new workshops being added to website

NTUUC Minister Representative - Oak Cliff has reached capacity for the 3rd time with people even having to park in the grass.

Loud Enough For All? YES!

The one-shot appeal to raise \$400 to purchase an additional wireless headset went over the top! We raised \$523. Many thanks to the donors. The new microphone system has been ordered and with the surplus, there will be funds to replace a faulty trasmitter.

Treasurer's Report

In the month of December, we had income of \$3,476 from general operations. After operations expense of \$2,478 for the month, we had a net income from operations of \$1,158.

In December we received generous donations of \$500 for the Elevator fund and \$15 for the Wi-Fi Fund.

For the year to date period, we had a net income of \$13,332 from operations. Those included restricted amounts of \$9,576. The total change in cash for the month was a decrease of \$1688.

As of the end of December 2015, we had total cash of \$68,078 and our debt totaled \$29,114.

In November, we donated \$150 from the Share the Plate program to the Earth Day Festival.


