Board Bits from September

Here's highlights of the Sept. 11th board meeting:

- Agreed to devote time to update the church's history. While we have binders with historical information (board minutes, Sunday bulletins, financial information, etc.) the electronic version of the "Board Book" is woefully outdated. During this church year all critical information will be scanned and each board members will receive an updated flash drive. The same information will be backed up to DVDs and placed in the church safe deposit box at the bank.
- Our QuickBooks Application has a glitch and needs the attention of someone who has experience using QuickBooks. Can you help? If so, speak with Kelly Cofield.
- Agreed the monthly board representative will work with the Sunday morning greeter on duty to assist newcomers and visitors so they can feel warmly welcomed and have an opportunity to fill out a guest card
- Reviewed and agreed, by consensus, to reaffirm the Board of Trustees' Covenant (a copy is available in the Congregational Governance tab of the church web site.

We're Hosting a Conference!

It all began in August 2014 when Red River hosted a one-day conference *Wide Awake Worship* with Dr. Christine Tata as the facilitator. Thirty-three UUs from across north Texas attended. By all reports we did well. A seed was planted.

Last year Pathways UU decided to hold a one-day conference focusing on Religious Education. It too was a success and the event received a name - Small Congregations Conference - with the aim of having all the tiny congregations in the area (along with the big ones too, if they wished to attend) come together to network, swap ideas, concerns and to help one another.

This year, Arlington UU hosted the 2nd Small Congregations Conference that had different workshops for people to attend. Kelly Cofield, Marla Loturco and Dan Althoff attended and driving home they thought, "Why don't we host the 2017 conference?" In three years the gathering has evolved from an event to a tradition!

Might you be interested in being on the Planning Committee for this March 11, 2017 one-day event? A few folks have been brain storming. The first step is to send a survey to all small UU congregations within a reasonable driving distance from Red River (14-16 depending on what one feels is a "reasonable" distance). The purpose is to solicit suggestions for topics people would find sufficiently intriguing to entice the drive.

To spark their thinking, several potential topics are suggested:

- Security issues
- Music in worship
- Using social media
- Stewardship
- Church growth
- Creating religious space

In the month of August, we had income of \$3287 from general operations. After operations expense of \$2624 for the month, we had a net income of \$663.

In August, we donated \$157 from the Share the Plate program to the Earth Day Festival.

There was a donation of \$15 to the wi-fi fund.

Building insurance of \$210. UUA donation of \$236.50 (\$118.25 for July and August because I overlooked this requirement in July).

Water and waste bill of \$214, electric bill of \$212, gas of \$120 (July of \$59, Aug of \$61), Cable One of \$67.50.

FROM THE WORSHIP TEAM

Words, words, words!

I'm so sick of words

I get words all day through

First from Him, now from you

*Is that all we UU's can do?**

(*With apologies to Lerner and Loewe)

During our Aug 21st Leadership Workshop the discussion focused, briefly, on a variety of words that are used during things on Sunday. Several people felt the term “things” (as in “The Order of Things” “After Things”) misses the mark because our time together is more than just a thing. (The term was first introduced as a way for visitors to instantly see that what we do on Sunday morning will be distinctively different.)

Many have felt that traditional liturgical language - worship, prayer, hymn, benediction, etc. - equally miss the mark and, for a few, such words are highly charged and even offensive.

The Worship Team has, over the last several years, found ways to label the various things we do on Sunday morning that reflect our own approach to the things we do on Sunday morning. We sing songs (albeit from our hymnal). We may have a meditation or a mus-ing or a prayer or simply called that part of our time Practices. We tend to call the focal point of what happens during Sunday morning as a Reflection or Remarks rather than a Sermon. Another word-play has given us a Call to Community rather than an Introit.

We do not, however, know what to call our time together. We're not alone in this. Many UU congregations struggle with what terms to use to explain or honor or enhance the things that happen during the hour together on Sunday morning. The Ethical Society refers to this special hour as “Platform” while at Pathways, UU's come on Sunday morning to share time they call “Common Ground.”

A lot of people feel Worship is the perfect word, others won't come if the word is used. Some ask, if we call it Service, “What service are we doing?” Recently we've used Celebration or Assembly rather than Worship and have simply called the paper we hold a Program.

We all appreciate variety in our Worship and having a lexis tailored to a specific Service may be more meaningful than having each Assembly contain the same jargon. We trust that if you are offended during Things by a particular word, know that there will be other Platforms when you are content and the dude sitting next to you is pissed. Because if we all liked or disliked the same things, we'd be Baptists rather than Unitarian Universalists.
