The UN Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela Prize recognizes the achievements of those who dedicate their lives to the service of humanity in the promotion of reconciliation and social cohesion, and in community development, guided by the purposes and principles of the United Nations. We are delighted to welcome him back!

Tom's wife, Lynn Waldron currently works with the Wendell State Forest Alliance to prevent logging in public forests in Massachusetts to include chaining herself to other protestors last year to prevent a Feller Buncher from operating to protect old growth oak forest.

She has joined Tom as actress and singer in the Jobs With Justice annual *Voices of Labor History* production to celebrate and honor May Day. She also performs in a hospice choir singing at bedside for the critically ill and dying.

It is a joy having them with us today.
