Will You Help?



I am writing to you with a personal request. We know this legislative session is unlike any we've ever seen before and that we are attempting to fight all types of injustice in Texas at this point. Josh (TX UU Justice Ministry) shared with us at our board meeting last week the fires he has been putting out around voter suppression and how your advocacy is making a difference. He also shared that some of the most egregious legislation introduced this session has centered on transgender youth in Texas.

Most of you probably don't know that I am the mother of a transgender child. I don't often share this in professional circles because I live in a fairly constant fear that disclosing my child's authentic identity endangers their life. However, I am asking you as a friend, colleague, and fellow human being to please help me advocate for my child's continued existence here in Texas. To me, the stakes are that dire.

If these bills pass, not only will my child be prevented from accessing life-saving medical care, but I will be prosecuted as a child abuser, with my child being put into foster care, should I allow them to access that care.

Will Jon Help?

Here is a list of bills that I am asking you to call your legislators about:

- 1. <u>HB 1399 and SB 1311:</u> prevents health providers from giving children medically necessary transition care (e.g., puberty delaying medications or hormone support).
- 2 <u>SB 1646:</u> adds the provision of transition care to transgender youth as statutorily child abuse.
- 3 <u>SB 1148:</u> prevents children from changing their birth certificate to reflect their gender expression.

These are the key talking points:

- Medical decisions should be kept between parents and their team of medical providers. The Texas government should not be intervening in the private medical decision of parents.
- 2. These bills promote vast government overreach and do not reflect the small government values we have as Texans.
- 3. These bills are discriminatory toward children- a vulnerable population we should be protecting not politicizing.
- 4. Bills like this make it difficult for Texas businesses to recruit and retain a vibrant workforce since it doesn't allow for families to receive equal treatment and medical care. <u>These businesses have all come out</u> <u>against these bills</u> and have threatened to pull financial support.
- 5. The religious community won't stand for the discrimination and targeting of children. It stands against the principles of every faith tradition.

Treasurer's Report for March

In the month of March, we had total receipts of \$6,403.59. Expenses for the month totaled \$2,459.42. The result was an excess of receipts over expenditures of \$3,944.17.

As of March 31, 2021, we had \$6,472.41 available in checking, \$16,532.20 in general savings, \$13,784.67 in the Endowment Fund at UUCEF, and \$62,560.41 in the Savings Fund at UUCEF for a total of \$92,883.40 in all savings accounts. We have a total of \$4,171.29 remaining on the renovation loan.
