This morning we welcome back to our pulpit Metta Suttathe venerable Tashi Nyima. Lama Tashi has studied under eminent Lamas of the Jonang, Nyingma, Sakya, Kagyu, and Geluk lineages of Vajrayana (Tibetan) Buddhism, and leads the Universal Compassion Buddhist Congregation, with Sanghas in North and South America.

For more than three decades, he has shared non-sectarian Dharma teachings in person and through extensive use of social media and virtual platforms, and leads several meditation retreats for animal rights activists throughout the year. He publishes two daily Dharma blogs: <u>GreatMiddleWay.wordpress.org</u>, and <u>GranViaCentral.wordpress.org</u> (Spanish), and manages several Buddhist internet groups.

Known for his directness, clarity of expression, and sense of humor, Lama Tashi is the author of *The Buddha's Bowl*, a collection of Buddhist instructions on radical compassion for animals, and *The Dharma Handbook*, an extensive commentary on a seminal text by Dolpopa Sherab Gyaltsen. He has also published *El cuenco del Buda* and *Meditación sin mitos* in the Spanish language.
