The Significance of Ramadan Dr. Riem Rostom – video message

This year, the holy month of Ramadan is expected to begin on Friday, Feb. 28, or Saturday, March 1, 2025. The exact timing is based on the sighting of the moon. For practicing Muslims is a time for reflection, prayer, fasting, doing charitable deeds and spending time with family. Adults fast during daylight hours, abstaining from food and drink as an important self-discipline to show devotion to their faith and become closer to Allah. At the end of Ramadan, *Eid al-Fitr* a three-day celebration as they break their fast. Ramadan is the fourth of the five pillars of Islam. The other four are one. declaration of faith, 2. the five daily prayers, 3. charity. 4. Pilgrimage to Mecca

This week's morning assembly is presented by Dr. Riem Rostom, a professor of mechanical engineering at Indiana State University. Her topic - Ramadan, the holy month of fasting in the Muslim faith – is a way for us to learn about this holiday

The festival always includes children's activities, workshops, vendors, displays, demonstrations, music, and drive through recycling. The Red River UU Rainbow Team will hold a free kid clothing swap at the festival.

This year's festival will coincide with the Sherman Symphony Orchestra's Spring Concert, and we are collaborating with the director of the orchestra to coordinate a transition between the two events. Recycled art shows coordinated by TCOG (Texoma Council of Governments) and Sherman ISD early childhood centers will remain on display for the reception following the concert. Awards will be given to winners in the TCOG art show during the reception.

Sherman's new professional soccer team Texoma FC has a game that evening at Bearcat Stadium adjacent to the festival. Their marketing manager reached out to coordinate activities, and we will meet with him very soon.

Money Matters

As of November 30, 2024, we had \$23,589.04 available in checking for general operations. There was also \$9,934.74 available in the bank savings account for

general operations plus \$4,871.08 restricted for the Minister Fund and \$5,951.89 held in trust for Kat Walston from the sale of her personal effects prior to moving into assisted living. In addition, we invested a total of \$66,784.40 in the UUA Common Endowment Fund. The congregation voted to use up to \$51,000.00 of the UUA Savings Fund for minister compensation.
