The Stewardship Campaign ...

On May 18 we will hold our spring congregational meeting. One of the main purposes of this meeting is to approve our budget for July 1, 2025, through Jine 30, 2026. The Finance Team is recommending a budget of \$51,500 for this upcoming year. The breakdown of this budget is:

Facilities 43%	Worship 25%	Admin/Other 17%	Consultants 12%	Social Justice 3%

To pay for the items covered in this budget the Finance Team is recommending a pledge goal of \$48,000. As of April 1st, we have 12 members who have pledged to date and 3 non-members have also pledged for a total of \$23,680. That puts us at 48% of our target goal of \$48,000.

The stewardship campaign ends April 30th. If you have not yet filled out a pledge form, there are forms in the lobby. Please give your paper form to Carole Harner or mail it to RedRiver UU, P.O. Box 1806, Denison Tx. 75021.

From the UllA ...

From the UUA, an update about Social Justice. Just as love knows no borders, our dedication to justice reaches across boundaries and walls. We show up on the side of love with all families, regardless of citizenship status, and strive to create welcoming communities and congregations. We organize and advocate for immigration reform, for an end to detentions and deportations, and for a world where hands are extended in peace and care across borders and no one feels forced to leave home or risk death in pursuit of a decent life for their family. We affirm <u>immigration as a moral issue</u> and have long <u>spoken out in support</u> of immigrant justice.

What We Are Doing

 The UUA-UUSC Love Resists campaign is activating and helping people resist the criminalization of immigrant and other communities targeted by the current administration by expanding sanctuary, growing solidarity and raising our voices.

We are partnering with <u>Mijente</u>, <u>We Belong Love</u> <u>Resists</u>

- <u>#Not One More Deportation</u>
- <u>Together</u>, the National Day Laborer Organizing Network, the Interfaith Immigration Coalition and others in their efforts to end deportations.
- <u>New Sanctuary Movement</u>
 - We are providing sanctuary to people appealing deportation orders, refugee children, and families fleeing violence. We are part of the movement to create "Sanctuary Cities" across the country that have welcoming policies towards immigrants.
- <u>Social Justice Trips to the U.S./Mexico Border</u> The Unitarian Universalist College of Social Justice offers service learning trips to the border. Journeys are grounded in theological reflection and help individuals, groups, and congregations understand the issues and discern a path toward effective action.

Why is the above in this newsletter? Simple. It is a reminder of an important reason we are UU's.

Money Matters ...

In the month of February, we had total operating receipts of \$1,600.00. Total operating expenses for the month were \$2,608.69, leaving us with a net loss for the month of (\$1,008.69). The net loss for the month was due to lower donations, partly offset by the timing of insurance costs.

For the fiscal year-to-date we had an operating net loss of (\$707.30). The year-to-date net loss was due to lower donations, partly offset by lower communication and worship expense.

Marilyn Alexander's daughter, Merrilee Kick, donated \$60,361.00 this year to cover repairs and renovations. A total of \$56,467.82 has been spent. That leaves \$3,893.18 remaining in this fund as of February 28. Part of this will be spent in March for handrails by the back door.

As of February 28, 2025, we had \$18,942.42 available in checking for general operations. There was also \$9,937.35 available in the bank savings account plus \$4,871.08 restricted for the Minister Fund and \$5,951.89 held in trust for Kat Walston. In addition, we have invested a total of \$66,784.40 in the UUA Common Endowment Fund. The congregation voted to use up to \$51,000.00 of the UUA Savings Fund for minister compensation.
