

New Horizons for a Living Tradition



The consolidation of the American Unitarian Association and the Universalist Church of America created the Unitarian Universalist Association.

This month is the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the American Unitarian Association and the summer issue of the UU World focuses on an abundance of reflections, poems, and highlights William Ellery Channing's seminal "Baltimore Serman of 1819, which defined the movement that in 1825 – 200 years ago this May – created the American Unitarian Association.

Money Matters

In the month of March, we had total operating receipts of \$12,137.56. Total operating expenses for the month were \$4,176.64, leaving us with a net profit for the month of \$7,960.92. The net profit for the month was due to the timing of pledge payments for the current year and the prepayment of some pledges for next year.

For the fiscal year-to-date we had an operating net profit of \$7,253.62. The year-to-date net profit was due to the timing of pledge payments for the current year and the prepayment of some pledges for next year, in addition to lower communication and worship expenses.

Marilyn Alexander's daughter, Merrilee Kick, donated \$60,361.00 this year to cover repairs and renovations. A total of \$57,035.07 has been spent. That leaves \$3,325.93 remaining in this fund as of March 31.

As of March 31, 2025, we had \$23,007.60 available in checking for general operations. There was also \$9,939.91 available in the bank savings account plus \$4,871.08 restricted for the Minister Fund and \$5,951.89 held in trust for Kat Walston. In addition, we invested a total of \$66,784.40 in the UUA Common Endowment Fund in 2020, which has increased in value. The congregation voted to use up to \$51,000.00 of the UUA Savings Fund for minister compensation.

We considered this a remarkable success considering that the turnout for Earth Day this year was less than other years due to weather uncertainty and other festival events in our area.

Based on how our booth looked (visually) we decided to order a better tent with the church name and logo printed on the tent canopy. We plan to have that ready for the Pride Festival in June.
